EVOLVE:

The EVOLVE series was very beneficial and everyone likes the idea of keeping it as a series because there is more buy into the series. Amanda Masterpaul also agreed that EVOLVE should be kept as a series, because it allows for relationships to be built between the facilitator and attendees and attendees with each other.

Supplemental Classes:

Some classes mentioned to have for next year were pronouns in the workplace, conflict resolution, microaggressions in the workplace, disability in the workplace, what are fair accommodations and mental health days with paid leave.

Other Ideas:

Dr. Jessica Greene agreed that she likes what's happening within our efforts of DEI, but she would like to continue to grow the educational aspect of DEI. She wants others to learn that DEI isn't just about race and that's there's so much more to it. It's important to dig deeper into the history of DEI and the different aspects.

Cindy mentioned that part of the mission of this council is for others to implement these practices into their businesses.

Amanda mentioned that having staggering classes to allow individuals that grow out of beginner learning stages of DEI into a more proficient area can have challenging courses as well. The EVOLVE series could be the beginning of staggering courses. She also mentioned potentially creating a program like LGS, but for DEI. Amanda would also like to make LGS more diverse and have the students attend a variety of different businesses that include minority businesses.

Yaritza explained what she has done for the Hispanic community and what will be updated in 2024. Flyers have been updated; members will be hosting classes here that are Spanish. Evelyn will be able to do one on ones to help individuals from start to finish with creating their business.

The HRC and police department are going to work with business owners to have stickers in their windows that let the public know that they are safe places. Possibly

could connect with other chambers and civic groups to include them in DEI events. This would allow them to grow and learn since they may not have a DEI program.
